



According to Wikipedia, the Drifters are a long-lasting American doo-wop and R&B/soul vocal group. They were originally formed to serve as a backing group for Clyde McPhatter (of Billy Ward and his Dominoes) in 1953. There were three Golden eras of the Drifters; the early 1950s, the 1960s and the early 1970s.

Few American vocal groups can be truly called legendary, yet the Drifters have carved their names at the top of the rhythm-and-blues, pop and doo-wop pyramid of legends.

For the first time in Fil-Am community history, the '50s to '70s Billboard chart-toppers will headline an equally enduring expo and cultural show: Fiesta In America!

The Drifters will traipse down memory lane with their avid Filipino fans on Aug. 12, starting at 12 noon; and Aug. 13, starting at 10 a.m. with Mass and Santacruzian parade, at New Jersey's Meadowlands Expo Center in Secaucus, N.J.

"This year will mark Fiesta In America's 19th Anniversary," Nanding Mendez, Fiesta In America's President and CEO, announced.

"To celebrate our milestone, I can think of no musical act that can refresh our fans' memories of youthful romance better than the Drifters, accompanied by their full band. The concert will truly be one for the ages."

The group's line-up has evolved several times since the Drifters were formed in 1953, but they are collectively best-remembered for 13 Billboard Hot 100 hits that have become timeless classics.

Their discography consists of gold records such as "Save the Last Dance for Me" (a massive single in 1960, it was also a recent cover hit by Michael Bublé), "There Goes My Baby" (the first rock-and-roll record to feature a string orchestra), "This Magic Moment," "Up on the Roof," "On Broadway" (which reached Number 5 in the U.S.), and "Under the Boardwalk."

The latter is still an FM radio adult-contemporary staple; it was covered by Bruce Willis, the Rolling Stones, Bette Midler and other artists.

Among various honors, the Drifters have been enshrined in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame twice as a group.

Front men Clyde McPhatter and Ben E. King were inducted in the Hall of Fame as individual artists.
