

Without his globally and internally condemned extrajudicial killings (EJKs), President Rodrigo Duterte would have been sitting in a "comfortable train coach" of history.

Instead, he is being compared to Adolf Hitler.

He may also qualify in comparison to Idi Amin of Africa or to Pol Pot of Asia, both notorious for killing their own people extrajudicially during their reign as leaders of their respective nations.

With over 12,000 reported deaths blamed on his bloody and brutal anti-drug campaign, Mr. Duterte has been in the condemnation radar of international human rights organizations and advocates, as well as internal anti-Duterte groups inside the Philippines, including the influential Catholic Church.

The United Nations Human Rights Commission in Geneva, Human Rights Watch in New York, Amnesty International in London, European Union Parliament, House of Lords in London, a group of U.S. Senators and a large number of Americans have condemned Duterte's EJK since he assumed the presidency in June 2016.

There is a pending complaint against President Duterte in the International Criminal Court in The Hague.

Those HR groups are now demanding accountability for the killings in the past 16 months.

In the Philippines, a number of anti-Duterte organizations have sprouted since the killing of three innocent teenagers in August.

The latest was a group of lawyers who called themselves "Mga Manananggol Laban sa Extra Judicial Killings" or "Manlaban sa EJKs."


Almost on a daily basis, hundreds of Filipinos criticize Mr. Duterte's EJK in social media.
