No idle days for peacekeepers

MANILA — Starting last Friday, the Filipino peacekeepers who arrived from the Ebola-stricken West African state of Liberia started observing routine military activities to keep them busy while they are quarantined at the Philippine Navy's new facility on Caballo Island in

Cavite. The routine duties started with regular morning calls, morning exercises, sports activities and gardening to help transform Caballo into a fully green island, according to Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) spokesperson Lt. Col. Harold Cabanoc.

The Philippine Navy has provided coconut seedlings for the soldiers to plant in the island. The peacekeepers will also cook their own food out of the supplies that would be provided by the AFP Joint Task Group Liberia led by Capt. Luzviminda

4 Fil-Am vets in vigil at Arlington

WASHINGTON — On Veterans Day, four Filipino-American veterans and their supporters visited Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington County, Virginia, to recall and honor the sacrifices of 400,000 military service members buried there since the Civil War.

Filipino World War II veterans Celestino Almeda, 97, and Pontenciano Dee, 87, were joined by their younger comrades, former U.S. Army Chaplain Georgette Beltran and retired U.S. Army Maj. Sonny Bosa.

Will use discretion to rewrite some laws

At least five million unauthorized aliens will be protected from deportation and provide them with work permits, according to an executive order said to be issued this week by the White House.

President Barack Obama is also expected to spell out other changes overhauling the nation's immigration system.

But the unprecedented plan is likely to be overturned by the next Congress, which will be controlled by Republicans, who oppose immigration legislation proposed by the Obama Administration.
